### The Acorns


Today we have completed our life cycle DT food technology project that we have been working on. Over the last 3 weeks we have made hungry caterpillar fruit kebabs, vegetable wrap cocoons and finished off with butterfly buns. We have developed lots of physical skills during this project: bridge hold, cutting, slicing, peeling, grating, spreading, mixing, weighing, sharing, rolling, cracking and pouring. We also got to use our maths skills to create repeating patterns, symmetry, measuring, sharing and doubling. Our favourite bit was definitely the taste testing at the very end though.

The Seedlings

This week, the Seedlings have embarked on a fascinating journey through history, creating timelines that explore the impactful lives of Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell. Our PSHE discussions have been equally insightful, focusing on personal strengths and what makes each of us unique and incredible.

We've also been getting to know our local area better, identifying both human and physical features on maps.

Meanwhile, we have completed an exciting art project, diving into the world of printmaking. The Seedlings have created vibrant artwork using simple print techniques, leaf rubbings, and Styrofoam templates inspired by William Morris.
