This week we are in full swing with our measurement units in Maths and the children are enjoying the practical aspects of the topic. We had a superb History Lesson this week delivered by Chloe from Skipton Museum. She brought in a wonderful collection of artefacts from the Stone Age and Iron Age which the children could hold. The lesson was very 'hands on' for the children as they became archaeologists for the afternoon, trying to decipher what the objects were and how they would have been used.

They used magnifying glasses to look closely at the different materials and also made a human timeline in the classroom!

On Tuesday morning, we welcomed: Chloe Fowler from Craven Museum to deliver a workshop about WWII and the Home Front. 
So we are going to do a joint party!
