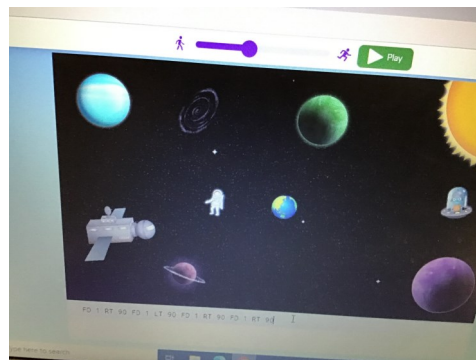

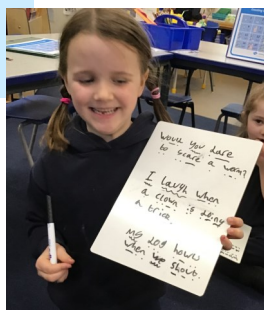
Acorns

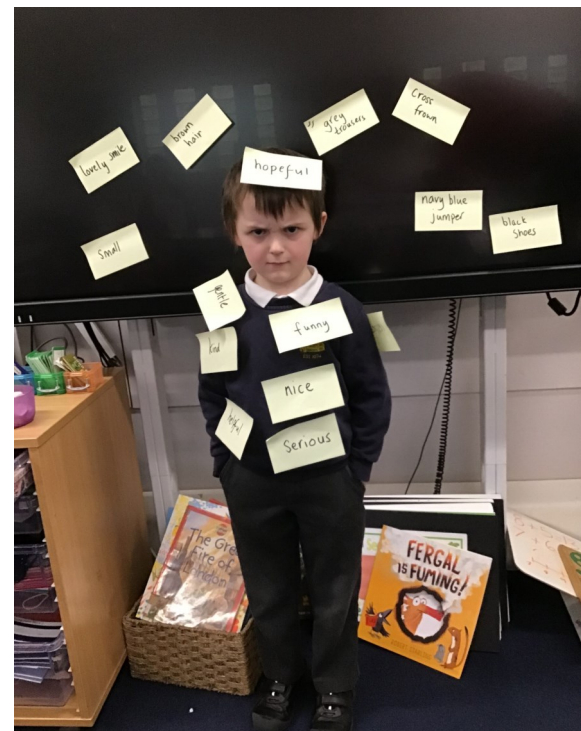
Saplings

This year marks 25 years since World Book Day began. The idea behind World Book Day is to inspire children to read.

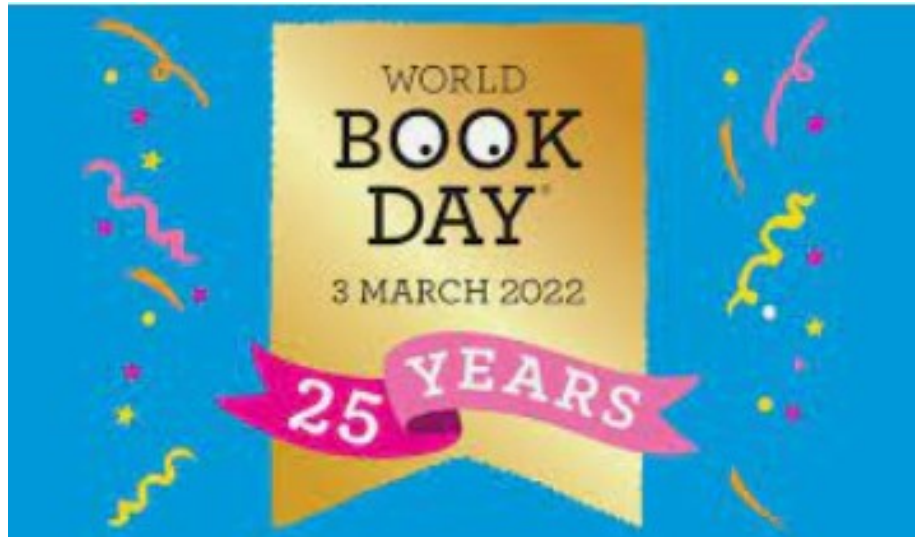
