

At the moment, the provision for the reception children is based around the theme of pirates. The children have really enjoyed it and have even organised a section of the classroom and have produced beautiful artwork to make their own role-play area.

After measuring items with non-standardised measuring equipment, the children have moved on to using cm to measure things; using a range of rulers for these activities. In literacy, we have been learning and thinking of rhyming words which we are going to use in our own poems.



Curlews

The Curlews have been developing their journalistic skills by learning to use sensationalised language in news articles. After learning about the exciting discoveries at Skara Brae, the children have been putting their journalistic skills. On Tuesday, we excitedly joined in a live lesson hosted by the Blue Planet which brought the Earth's rich marine life alive. The children really enjoyed it.

In numeracy, the year 2s have been measuring objects with cm and meters in preparation of converting between the two units. The year 3&4 children have been developing their decimal understanding.
