This half-term we have been enjoying different tales by Beatrix Potter. The children have written some fantastic character descriptions and have also produced some delightful drawings and paintings. News from the Curlews

What another busy, hardworking term it has been in the Curlews. In maths the children have been getting to grips with data; recording and interpreting different types of data. This week the children have worked on their money skills. They have been exploring all the different ways you can make amounts of money with different coins and notes. The children have also been finding amounts of change in a practical context. Our inspiration for our writing this half term has come from a beautiful picture book called 'Flood' and most recently the Legend of Finn McCool. The Giant's Causeway has sparked an interest with the children this week so please do continue to learn more about this natural wonder at home. Children have enjoyed learning about 'Sound' in science, particularly the investigations arising from this topic and are now becoming very proficient at writing up their findings. We will be continuing our Extreme Earth topic after half term and the children will be exploring 'Living Things and their Habitats' in science.

News from the Red Kites

This term pupils have focused on persuasive writing with links to our topic which has been Extreme Earth - they have even written letters about micro plastics to MP Julian Smith. In Maths we have been learning about Measure and Year 6s have done some Algebra, too. Pupils have also been learning about Sound in Science and looked closely at the human ear.



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SATs

Our Y2s and Y6s have now completed all their SATs papers. We are delighted with the calm and focused manner in which the children approached what can be a stressful and demanding 4 days. We are all hoping that the hard work and determination they have shown over the last year will be captured in their results which will be given to parents in early July.

Cober Hill

Y6s have had a very successful cluster schools' trip to Cober Hill in Scarborough. The weather remained dry but cool - perfect for outdoor learning. Staying away from home for 3 nights is an incredibly brave achievement and we applaud pupils for their bravery and resilience and also their parents for supporting and encouraging this key part of the Year 6 curriculum.
