Care, Support and Guidance

All adults within the school are committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for all children.

We make sure we listen to children's thoughts and opinions, and offer support and guidance, working with parents and other agencies when necessary, to overcome any difficulties, and ensure there are no hindrances to children's development.

We also aim to provide an education that will meet the needs of all of our children, so we provide extra help and support for those children who need it. Children with special educational needs are quickly identified and appropriate support is put in place to allow them to develop to their full potential.

Our Special Education Needs Coordinator (SENCo – qualification through Edgehill University) works hard to help children deal with any issue that causes a barrier to their learning.

We take the safeguarding of children very seriously, and follow rigorous procedures to ensure the safety of our children at all times.

Children in our school are also encouraged to support each other. The School Council are ready to listen to any concerns children have, and to try to help.

Older children are appointed as Playground Buddies, to help children enjoy a safe and happy playtime.

Partnership with Parents

At Threshfield Primary School we have a welcoming atmosphere and actively seek to involve families in the life of our school. The Headteacher or a member of staff is in the playground at the start and end of the day.

Many queries and concerns can be dealt with at this time. Each half-term, we open our school up to parents so that they can join their children in lessons. During these events, one of our classes will often put on a perform in the school hall. These events provide opportunities to look at the colourful displays around school, presenting your child’s work, look through exercise books and see exciting lessons around school.

As well as this, parents are given two school reports and are invited to two parents’ evenings over the year to discuss your child’s progress in all subjects and their social interactions with their peers. Parents are, of course, welcome to make an appointment to see the teacher at other times.

We are committed to working closely with parents and will always find the time to talk.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

We are lucky to have an active Parents’ Association which organises and assists with special events, such as school fairs, Film nights and discos. They are also excellent at organising parent events to further develop an enhanced school community and support network.
