What busy bees we have been this week in the Seedlings classroom. As we are hoping to create a bee friendly garden, we thought we would learn lots of information about bees. After our research we illustrated and wrote about the lifecycle of a honey bee. Challenge has been the theme in Maths this week and we really rose to the occasion, with year 1 mastering place value of two digit numbers and year 2 working on their reasoning skills.

Our Friday carousel was very exciting; writing our own book in French, learning new songs in Music and bathing in Nature in our Outdoor Learning.

It's been great to spend my first week with Oak Class, getting to know them all better and finding out what a talented group of young people they are. Our focus this week has been starting our new cross-curricular topic, 'The Deep', and we've been lucky enough to watch some live tutorials for World Ocean day, we even got some of the questions we posted answered.
