The Seedlings

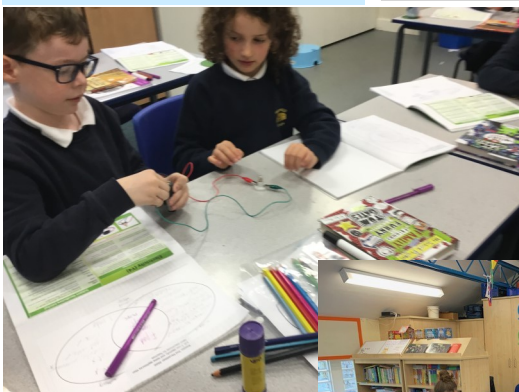
What another busy week in The Seedlings class.
