Valentines Disco

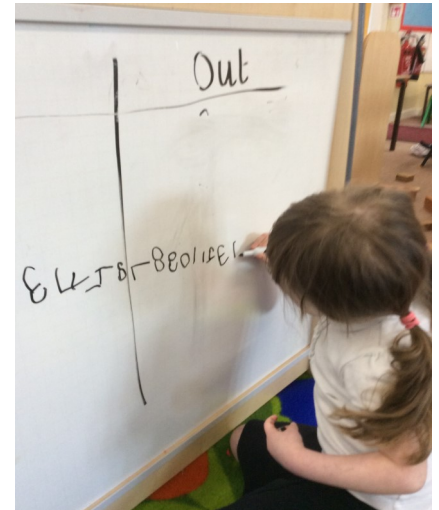
On Friday 14th February there will be a valentines disco at Linton Village Hall from 4-5.30pm. Everybody welcome.

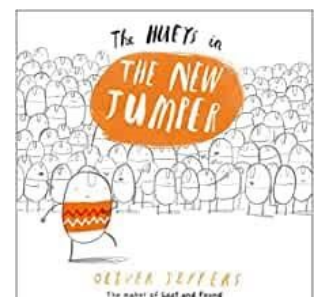


Red Kites
