Dojo

If you can help, please would you inform the school office or your child's class teacher via Dojo. Thank you



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
The One-Way System

Hopefully everyone is aware of the on-way system which we have organised to support the drop-off and pick-up of children from school.

Our school is set in such an idyllic setting, however the roads around school are not wide or have pavements and our car-park is relatively small compared to the number of cars which use it daily. Therefore, the on-way system is vital to ensuring the safety of our school community, both pupils and parents.

We ask parents to travel down to school on Church Road (from the Linton direction) and then continue past school, towards Station Road (in the direction of Grassington) at both drop-off and pick-up times. This limits the need for parents to be reversing down the roads if a car is coming in the opposite direction.

Other ways you can help the congestion:

The congestion of cars is better in the morning drop-off due to the children arriving over a ten minute period: 8.50am - 9.00am. Therefore, the Kingfishers Class (Class 1) will be released from 3.25pm. A member of staff is always on the gate each morning and evening, therefore a window of ten minutes will be added to the evening. Children in the older classes can be picked up between 3.30pm - 3.40pm.
