Pupil Premium

Please could I draw your attention to one area that we would like to encourage as it may provide huge benefits for the pupils within school. Pupil premium is additional money the school receives for pupils who are in some way disadvantaged (this could include adoption, looked after children, armed forces children, those whose parents are receiving some form of benefits or those who have been eligible for free school meals within the past 6 years).

The substantial amount of money received is used to help these pupils to have extra assistance where needed or to subsidise their school trips, intervention resources, breakfast club and after school clubs, including WHOOSH. With budgets constantly cut in education, this money could be an enormous help to your child and also of benefit to the school, so if you think you may be eligible, please speak to Mr. Cook or Mrs. Whitaker in the school office.
